Christmas day! As we do so, we remember our fellow Christians who are grieving and struggling to find joy and hope during this season. Some Churches host what is called **Blue Christmas**, a gentle, contemplative Service for those who are carrying pain or loss during this season of celebration. Earlier this month, Bishop Christopher consecrated the **Chapel of Reconciliation** at Southwark Cathedral, in remembrance of the **Victims of violent crime and terrorism.**

In his Homily, Bishop Christopher paid tribute to the victims of the London Bridge Terror Attack, "We do so with great sadness and heavy hearts because not only do we bear the scars of the London Bridge Terror Attack more than five years ago, remembering those who perished, those who endured life changing injuries, those who were traumatised along with their families, colleagues and friends. But we do so with renewed sorrow because only last week two more young people from South London, became themselves tragic victims of knife crime – and we pray for them and their families in their devastating loss and grief".
