In John's Gospel the miracles of Jesus are called 'signs', meaning that while they might be amazing in themselves, their importance is in pointing us to something even more amazing. This week's Gospel tells us of lesus' first miracle, or his first 'sign', as John calls it. At a wedding in Cana he was asked by his mother to do something to save a bride and groom the embarrassment of running out of wine. And so six large stone jars were filled with water and when tasted the water had become wine. Amazing as that is, John sees it as nothing more than a signpost; the first of many signposts, all pointing to something far, far greater than we can imagine. But signposts to what.....? Nothing less than that God lived among us; walked with us; talked with us; died for us; rose from the dead to forever make us children of God and heirs to God's
