THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

As we worship this morning, we are aware that through Lent we are moving towards Holy Week which will come very soon and which ends with Christ on the cross. Today's Gospel reading reminds us that lesus is throwing down the gauntlet, setting us a challenge to face. Jesus said "take up your cross". In other words, pick it up yourself. This means we have a choice to make. When we take up our cross, we step out into the unknown, the less travelled road. It can be difficult because we don't know what is round the next corner. Taking up our cross and following him is about trust, and obedience, of giving ourselves, and knowing that wherever he leads will be a place of love and grace as we enter into a deeper relationship with Christ. It isn't easy, but it draws us closer to him and makes us more Christ-like, for never has such a symbol of pain and torture been transformed into a symbol of unending love and hope which is recognised the world over.
