Mothering Sunday is celebrated in churches on the Fourth Sunday in Lent. Traditionally it is a day when we thank God for the love of our mothers, and we thank them in person for their care for us. In the UK, the service dates back hundreds of years to the time when people were encouraged once a year, on Laetare Sunday, to return to their home or 'mother' church or cathedral. This means that there is a small but distinct difference between Mothering Sunday, and 'Mother's Day', the more commercial celebration.

Today when we celebrate Mothering Sunday, the focus is mostly on celebrating the mothers in our lives and it is a great opportunity to acknowledge and reflect on all the people in our lives who have "mothered" us in various ways. One could make the link to being thankful to those who first introduced you to Jesus and welcomed you into the church.

The main service on Mothering Sunday in churches across the country is central to the life of the church. The church recognises that the day may be difficult for some people and so it is common place for services to include prayers for those who don't find the day particularly easy.

Families across the country will be preparing little presents and cards and, in some churches, flowers are blessed and handed out during the main service.
