Today, **Trinity Sunday,** is the Feast of the Holy and Undivided Trinity. It's the beginning of the long period of Ordinary time, where the colour of the hangings and vestments in the church are changed to green - although festive white and gold are the colours for today itself.

Today's Feast brings to a sort of climax everything we have been celebrating since Christmas: The incarnation of God as he comes among us as the child of Bethlehem; how he spoke with the Father's authority and claimed power over sin and death; how the Spirit of God was sent to create and sustain the Church as Christ's body here on earth. Now we celebrate the perfect union of the three persons of the Godhead united in love and creativity.

In a sense, every feast must be a festival of the Trinity, because the whole Trinity is at work in every moment of creation, redemption and sanctification; but Trinity Sunday provides a particular occasion to reflect on the revelation of God's self as Trinity, immediately after the Great Fifty Days of Easter.
