

PALM SUNDAY

Today we begin the journey of Holy Week, the most important week of the Christian year. The triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem marked the real beginning of the way of the cross

for him. Palm Sunday was the beginning of the final count-down to the events of Easter. Jesus' manner of entry was carefully chosen. He could have simply walked into Jerusalem, in the usual way, with all the other travellers. Perhaps He was making a statement about being one of the people, ordinary, yet very different. This entry by Jesus perhaps foreshadowed his act at the Last Supper, of washing the disciples' feet, the act which showed the servant nature of this particular leader. It demonstrated the great gospel paradox that strength is made perfect in weakness. Interesting to note that Luke's narrative does not mention palms or indeed any other greenery. He does however mention Peace (Luke 19.28-40) when the disciples call out "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest heaven", which doesn't appear in Matthew, Mark or John.
