This text about the Good Shepherd has implications for us who are followers of Jesus. As his followers, we share the same concerns as he does, and show our love in very practical ways, as Jesus did.

In other words, we need to become shepherds to one another. We are to be shepherds to one another as members of our congregations. We are to be shepherds to one another in our families. Just as Jesus guides and protects his sheep, mothers and fathers guide and protect the lambs he has given to us in our families. Just as Jesus shepherds us with patience and love, we shepherd those whom God has entrusted to us. Just as Jesus, the good shepherd, gives protection and guidance through the ups and downs that life brings so too must we give guidance and help to the lambs God has given.

We don't know what tomorrow will bring, but we do know that we have a loving shepherd who walks with us through thick and thin.
