FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

What is a Christian? If you had to define what a Christian person was, how would you do it? Would they believe certain creeds, worship in particular ways, or would they have a certain spiritual model or belief system? It is a fascinating question and one which Jesus tackles in our reading today from John's Gospel. Jesus makes it clear that Christianity is not to be identified by a particular set of beliefs, a body of doctrines, membership of a certain church or denomination, or adherence to the Bible.

A Christian is fundamentally identified by love. Loyalty to our church, knowledge of scripture, religious devotion, all of this is incidental to the importance of being loving people. A Christian is recognised not by their creed but by their ability to reflect the love of God in their life.

Thy Kingdom Come Here - prayer walk your street What would it look like for the whole church in London, to pray for the whole city street by street? The Thy Kingdom Come Here is a London wide initiative, (www.thykingdomcomehere.uk) taking place this May and June, to prayer-walk the whole M25 region. it is an invitation for Christians to turn their everyday journeys into a prayer walk, and to record them on a map. Individual journeys are then logged on a digital map so individuals can see how their own prayer journeys are part of a collaborative effort to cover their area or city in prayer, street-by-street. As each street is prayed for, it changes colour so users are able to see which areas near them have been, or are waiting for someone to pray there. As more people pray "Your kingdom come here" on their journeys, the city changes colour but, more importantly, the city will be changed through prayers.
