FIRST SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY

On this first Sunday of Ordinary Time, we encounter Jesus' teaching about the Sabbath. When the Pharisees criticize him and his disciples for gleaning from the fields on the Sabbath, Jesus reminds them that when David, called by God and anointed by Samuel, was a fugitive being hunted by Saul, he stopped in the "house of God" for safety and food. The high priest gave David the consecrated bread that was reserved for priests in order to sustain the lives of David and his companions.

Jesus highlights this story with the reminder that "the Sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the Sabbath." The benefits of God benefit everyone, for God created the Sabbath, and to get bogged down in the rigidity of human law limits the scope of any benefits it may have held.

The reason for the Sabbath was and is to promote life and praise God as our creator and liberator. The Pharisees knew this, but were focused on the letter of the law and not the spirit in which Jesus applies it. Jesus is directly stating that he is the Son of Man and Lord of the Sabbath, which puts him in conflict with the Pharisees. Jesus is doing God's will, while the Pharisees are focused on gathering evidence against him.
