Today we are focusing on the theme 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself' *Galatians 5.14*.

In the words of Richard Reddie, Director of Justice and Inclusion at Churches Together in Britain and Ireland "Let us use Racial Justice Sunday (and other Sundays) to stand together in love, rejecting those words, actions and behaviours that go against Christ's teachings, and embracing those biblical principles that foment unity, cohesion and engagement."
