Little church by the railway celebrates 170th anniversary!

Last month, St Mark, South Norwood celebrated the 170th anniversary of its dedication. Here is a look back on its history and how the congregation celebrated the momentous occasion.

On Thursday 13 October in 1852, St Mark was dedicated as the Parish Church of South Norwood – in the Diocese of Canterbury under the tenure of Archbishop John Bird Sumner (1848–1862).

The parish now in its own right, and no longer the daughter church of All Saints, Upper Norwood joined the Diocese of Southwark in 1985 when 32 parishes of the Croydon Episcopal Area were added to complete the Diocese (created in 1905 from part of the Diocese of Rochester, covering the whole of the county of London south of the Thames and the Parliamentary divisions of East and Mid Surrey) as it exists now. As the congregation grew, it soon became necessary for another place to host the new congregants, and the decision was made to build Holy Innocents which later became a South Norwood Parish Church, in its own right and was dedicated in 1895.

On 1st December 2018, in accordance with the Mission and Pastoral Measure 2011, St Mark and Holy Innocents were united again, under the new title of the United Benefice of South Norwood, Holy Innocents and South Norwood, St Mark.

To mark the 170th anniversary, a Dedication Festival Mass was held on Sunday 16th October at the Church with the President and Preacher, The Most Revd Josiah Idowu-Fearon, former Secretary General of the Anglican Communion. Archbishop Josiah was accompanied by his wife Comfort, with whom the parish celebrated, as she is the first UKME Southwark Diocesan Mothers' Union President.

Commemorating the occasion, a special anniversary edition of the parish magazine was produced, which includes the history, mission and work of St Mark's, formerly referred to as 'the little church by the railway'; and celebration items on display in the church were (and still are) available to purchase by the congregation (and visitors).
