Letter from The Rt Revd Dr Rosemarie Mallett, Bishop of Croydon

The season of Advent is upon us, as we once again mark the beginning of the liturgical year, and prepare ourselves, our parishes, and our churches to celebrate the coming of Jesus into our world at Christmas. Advent is a time that focusses our attention on our need – both personal and collective – for hope of redemption and habits of hopefulness in changing and challenging times. As Christians, we find ourselves looking out from a world with many fractures and problems upon which the light of Christ, our coming king, will shine.

As the body of Christ, we are praying for peace and justice for the people and places suffering from war and oppression in the various conflicts in the world, and especially at this time in the Holy Land. In our own country, and here in Croydon, there are so many problems that people are dealing with, including poverty, homelessness, mental ill health, and increasing levels of violence on our streets. I am thankful that many of our churches are responding in loving action to help and support local people and I have already seen some of the plans for community engagement for the Advent and Christmas period.

As sisters and brothers in Christ, we are all members of the body of Christ, and as Paul reminds us, when one part of the body is hurting, we are all hurting. It is Christ who is the source, focus, and guarantor of our unity – he is the author and perfector or our faith – and in him each of us can find our home and our hope. We live in a world of suffering – into which Christ is coming, bringing his light and hope and healing. We, too, need this healing. We thank God for the gift of Christ – in and through Christ we can turn our faces to the future with both hope and hopefulness.
