On this Fourth Sunday of Advent, on our Advent Wreath, we light the candle for Mary, who bore Jesus in her womb, to complete the picture of those who prepared for the coming of Christ. We begun with 'The Patriarchs' which naturally focused on Abraham, our father in faith, and David, the ancestor in whose city Jesus was born. This was followed by 'The Prophets' which gave an opportunity to reflect on the way the birth of the Messiah was 'foretold'. Then last week, it was John, who proclaimed the Saviour.

Blessed are you, sovereign Lord, merciful and gentle:
to you be praise and glory for ever.
Your light has shone in our darkened world
through the child-bearing of blessed Mary;
grant that we who have seen your glory
may daily be renewed in your image
and prepared like her for the coming of your Son,
who is the Lord and Saviour of all.

As we pray for peace in the Holy Land and in other places of conflict around the world, I commend this prayer and appeal from the Anglican Archbishop in Jerusalem, The Most Revd. Hosam Naoum:

O God of all justice and peace, we cry out to you in the midst of the pain and trauma of violence and fear which prevails in the Holy Land.

Be with those who need you in these days of suffering; we pray for people of all faiths-Jews, Muslims and Christians and for all people of the land.

While we pray to you O Lord for an end to violence

While we pray to you, O Lord, for an end to violence and the establishment of peace, we also call for you to bring justice and equity to the peoples.

Guide us into your kingdom where all people are treated with dignity and honour as your children - for to all of us you are our Heavenly Father.

In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.
