Until then, I can only encourage you to work together, which will most likely involve some stepping up and some stepping out, as you continue to bring God's kingdom in this part of South London.

Of course, this means loving one another too and working out what that looks like; looking out for each another and being kind to one other – it's all Gospel imperative.

The COVID pandemic taught us some new skills, not least how to think fast on our feet and how to be creative and innovative. Those online entertainment evenings which turned out to be super events, thanks to those who were willing to stop shining their light under the bushel.

I remembered it well, my first foray into South Norwood on Racial Justice Sunday, 9th September 2012 at the invitation of the then Curate (now the Bishop of Ripon) who was going on holiday so needed someone to provide Cover at Holy Innocents, I0am Eucharist complete with baptism of young Aaron, who has from September 2023, joined Year 7 at Whitgift, having completed Years 2-6 at our St. Mark's Primary School. The following year, 2013, I was Licensed to Holy Innocents on September 28th the Eve of Michael and Archangels by the then Bishop of Croydon, the Rt. Revd. Jonathan Clark.

Then on January 22nd 2015, I was duly Licensed to St.

Mark, after a 3months vacancy following Father Tom Hurcombe's retirement at the end of October 2014. Tom and I agreed it was best that I start at St. Mark School as Vicar, from September 2014 – from then onwards, it has been a total joy and delight, to engage with the children, the staff and governors. All three headteachers have been great advocates for the school, which has transitioned from 'being in special measures' OFSTED category to currently 'a good school'. There were 3 commercial Banks on the High Street when I arrived, now there is none – must be something I said

Must say though, that its current eateries are a good representation of the United Nations. In the meanwhile, at the United Benefice, we started Joint Services as some occasions lend themselves to such - Palm Sunday (alternated, Maundy Thursday (SM) Good Friday (HI), Christmas Eve (SM), Christmas Day (HI). And at Holy Innocents, we started at 5.30am on Easter Eve, first Mass of Easter followed by champagne breakfast (the Vicar's encouragement to congregants); and placed Watch Night Eucharist and Covenant Renewal firmly in the Calendar.

So, it's only fitting that as I give thanks for all that has passed and look forward to all that is to come, my last Service should be on 3 Ist December, I I pm, Holy Innocents, during which I shall be interviewing that South London lad 'done good', Richard Blackwood — see you there!
