Building commenced in 1894 and was completed in 1895, the year in which it was dedicated by the then Bishop of Dover. As we prepare ourselves during Advent to receive again in our hearts and lives, the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ, we also look forward to the next 125 years of Holy Innocents Church, South Norwood. Today, our preacher is the current Bishop of Dover, the Rt. Revd. Rose Hudson-Wilkin, who will focus her sermon on the feast of the Holy Innocents while including the Advent themes.
