Last Thursday, on October 13<sup>th</sup> 2022, Saint Mark celebrated its 170<sup>th</sup> anniversary of dedication. On this day in 1852, in the Diocese of Canterbury under the tenure of Archbishop John Bird Sumner (1848-1862), St. Mark was dedicated as the Parish Church of South Norwood – a parish in its own right, no longer the daughter church of All Saints Upper Norwood.

St Mark joined the Diocese of Southwark in 1985 when 32 parishes of the Croydon Episcopal Area were added to complete the Diocese (created in 1905 from part of the Diocese of Rochester, covering the whole of the county of London south of the Thames and the Parliamentary divisions of East and Mid Surrey) as it exists now. As some of you know, the Parish of South Norwood, Holy Innocents begun its life as the daughter church of St. Mark before its dedication in 1895 – and now, here we are together again, as the United Benefice of South Norwood, Holy Innocents and Saint Mark - but, that's enough from me.



As you arrived at Church this morning, I hope you noticed in our new cabinet complete with lights, a number of items on sale to mark this anniversary. These

include the Anniversary Edition of the Parish Magazine, retailing at £5 each – in which you will read about the history, mission and work of "the little church by the



railway", now known as the Parish Church of South Norwood, St. Mark.

I commend it to you, having thoroughly enjoyed reading about the lives of the clergy and some of its parishioners in this South

Norwood community over the past 170years.

Please also take time to peruse the display of historical items including letters, photos and memorabilia covering the various decades.

We're still working on those intergenerational stories which capture the experiences of members of this parish church over the years. Watch this space!
